



Two Kansans With A Kodak

ust recently while traveling some of the back roads of Kansas and in the small town of Chanute, we came across a hidden treasure of a museum...the Martin and Osa Johnson Safari Museum. It is located in the historic Chanute train depot and shares its space with the public library.

The Safari Museum tells the story of two young people, American adventurers, naturalists and documentary filmmakers, who in the first half of the 20th century, captured the public's imagination through their films and books of adventure in exotic, faraway lands. They studied the wildlife and peoples of what was then known as the dark continent.

Ranked the No. 1 Museum in Kansas, the Martin and Osa Johnson Safari Museum features award winning exhibits of their lives and adventures. Two films are offered to visitors. One is 10 minutes and the other more detailed and lasting 80 minutes. There is also a research library and museum gift shop. There is plenty of parking and a small



admission fee is charged.

Porcupine Meatballs

These hearty and well seasoned meatballs are a fun twist on a traditional meatball recipe. These tasty meatballs are made with ground beef, rice, onion and seasonings then baked in a rich, hearty tomato sauce. So zesty and delicious too.

Ingredients:

1 tablespoon canola oil

1/2 cup uncooked long grain rice

1/2 cup water

1/3 cup chopped onions

½ tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

1/2 teaspoon garlic powder

1 lb ground beef

1 lb ground pork

1 (10-11 oz) can of tomato soup

1/2 cup water

1 1/2 tablespoons brown sugar

1 tbsp Worcestershire sauce




Instructions:

- 1. Place the canola oil in a large frying pan.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl combine the rice, water, soup mix, garlic powder, ground beef and ground pork. Mix together well (I always just use my hands since I have to form meatballs anyways) and form into 1 1/2 inch meatballs, around 22-25. They will be loose because of the water, but you need the moisture in there for the rice, trust me they will cook up nicely!
- 3. Heat a large frying pan and then fry all of the meatballs until golden brown on all sides. When starting, fry them for a long time on the first side, cooking them until they are really browned so that when you flip them, they don't fall apart.
- 4. Drain the excess fat off, then combine the last four ingredients together and pour over top of the meatballs.
- 5. Place a lid on top of the pan and simmer on medium-low heat for another 30-45 minutes, until the rice in the meatballs is cooked, stirring every 10 minutes or so.
- 6. Serve and enjoy! We make rice and serve these and the sauce over top.
- 7. I have made this recipe and froze in containers, then packed for camping trips. For an easy meal, place frozen food in a crockpot, on low temperature, and by dinnertime, food is good and hot.

Pageant of the Masters & Festival of Arts

he Pageant of the Masters (living pictures) and the Festival of Arts (140 Orange County artist that are juried in from the hundreds that compete in hopes of being selected) are two events held every summer in Laguna Beach, California, as it has been since the early 1930s.

FESTIVAL OF ARTS

The Festival is a highly acclaimed juried fine art show that featured 140 award winning artists where patrons are able to meet the artist. experience their art, watch demonstrations. participate in workshops, take daily art tours, enjoy live music, special events, and on-site restaurants. It is held at the Festival of Arts Grounds, 650 Laguna Canyon Road, Laguna Beach, CA.

History of the Festival of Arts spans 86-years. It began when the world was suffering from the trauma of the Great Depression but even during those difficult times artists arrived in Laguna

Beach because they were inspired by the coastline, the rambling hills, the vibrant and ever-changing ocean, and the freedom to follow their dreams. In 1932 a group of these artists banded together to find a way to raise the community's spirit by selling art.


That summer two dozen artists hung their paintings on fences, trees, and buildings along Laguna's main street, hoping to lure tourists to the

















first Festival of Arts, while other artists opened their homestudios to the public. Music. colorful signs and banners, parades and entertainment added to the celebratory event where Laguna Beach was turned into one enormous art gallery. Many artists happily arranged their easels and chairs and painted throughout the festival. And, yes, some even sold their paintings. Today, each year the Festival of Arts Permanent Collection is expanded through purchases from the exhibiting artists' work. The Permanent collection contains more than 1.000 pieces of fine art: paintings, sculpture, ceramics, glass, even furniture and jewelry – an 80-plus year collection as eclectic as the festival itself.

In 1933, the artists took another important action. They staged a publicity stunt that has grown into the Pageant of the Masters. A parade of local volunteers costumed as characters in famous works of art - Whistler's Mother, Mona Lisa, Atlas, among others – marched downtown along the Coast Highway to the location of the 2nd Festival of Arts, where they appeared one at a time inside a tiny, booth-like set, holding their poses as tableaux vivants — "living pictures." The show was so brief the audience didn't even sit down to enjoy the spectacle; they merely took a break from viewing the artists' displays to peek at these "living pictures." In 1935 the "living pictures" presentation was transformed into a full production with music, narration, and painted backdrops. The Pageant of the Masters

evolved into a summer tradition that now draws an audience of 150,000 (in 2018).

The Festival of Arts and Pageant of the Masters moved around Laguna Beach, from one location to another until 1941 when the City of Laguna Beach purchased the present six-acre Festival site. That summer the Festival of the Arts and Pageant of the Masters were held for the first time in their new permanent home. Today, these two events draw a quarter of a million visitors. The Festival of Arts Fine Art Show is one of the longest-running art exhibitions in the state; except during the years of World War II, when the Festival of the Arts and the Pageant were not held.

The Festival of Arts has grown into a world-famous cultural institution, awarding hundreds of thousands of dollars in college scholarships and yet the mission of the event remains the same: 'to promote, produce and sponsor events and activities that encourage the appreciation, study and performance of the arts'. The juried fine art exhibition provides local artists with a venue where they can display and sell their art. Media include mixed-media. paintings, sculpture, pastels, drawings, serigraphs. photographs. ceramics, jewelry, fiber arts, etched and stained glass, handcrafted furniture, and even scrimshaw.

Rated one of the top festivals in the nation, each year the Festival of Arts hosts Orange County's most talented artists. Avid art collectors and festival-

goers have an outstanding variety of fine art to browse through and to purchase as they walk among the artist's displays. This professionally juried fine art show features a diverse selection of artwork. Since opening in 1932, thousands of artists have shown and sold their artwork at the Festival of Arts and many have their work featured in the private collections of leading art collectors, celebrities, and museums around the world.

The Festival of Arts features a wide range of daily activities







the entire family can enjoy that include live music, guided art tours, and art workshops. For example the 2019 Festival of Arts featured Art and Story Time, a weekly series for children 5 and under that featured a different book read aloud plus a handson art project. Portraits on the Green featured Festival of Arts exhibitors as they painted. sculpted, and photographed live models on the Festival's Concert Stage. This series focused on how artists' interpret the same subject matter differently based on their own unique style and perspectives. Tribute Tuesdays Music Series brought to the stage some of Southern California's most well-known tribute bands. Talented performers paid homage to music legends as

they re-created popular songs. Art Talks and Tea offered fascinating and informative discussions with the Festival of Arts exhibitors. Tea was enjoyed on the Festival's green as artists and art aficionados talked about inspiration, history, and careers in art. Art, Jazz, Wine & Chocolate sweetened up the Festival of Arts as folks indulged your senses by sampling a wide variety of wines expertly selected to complement and enhance the nuanced flavors of specialty chocolates. The casual but classy outdoor setting, together with the soulful sounds of iazz surrounded by fine art, created an ideal evening for friends, sweethearts, and family. Art and Yoga with Lululemon allowed for the flexing of 'creative muscles'

> experienced as instructors yoga guided participants through a relaxing and meditative session outdoors and surrounded by fine art. Whether you were brand new to yoga or an experienced Yogi, all skill levels were welcome. Step into the Spotlight Music

Series brought to center stage some of the amazing voices that are usually seen (and heard) in the background. An extraordinary lineup of back-up singers and performers took the stage. Concerts on the Green presented the sounds of awardwinning musicians as they performed live in the "Concerts on the Green" series. Family Art Dav was a fun-filled, artfilled and enchantment-filled day. As kids arrived they were given a booklet full of coupons redeemable for special activities and treats. Kids participated in "Art Quest" - an art exhibit treasure hunt where they answered kid-friendly questions by investigating different exhibits throughout the grounds. Festival Runway Fashion Show (now in its 11th vear) featured Festival exhibitors who stepped out of their artistic medium and into the world of fashion. The result was over-the-top creative couture with the twist being that all were made out of recycled, reused, and reclaimed materials. It was a competition similar to TV's Project Runway. Festival artists start months in advance in hopes of taking home the top prize and bragging rights.



PAGEANT OF THE MASTERS

This is arguably one of the most unique productions in the entire world. Audiences are amazed and enchanted by ninety minutes of "living pictures", incredibly faithful re-creations of classical and contemporary works of art, with real people posing to look exactly like their counterparts in the original pieces. To appreciate and understand the tableaux vivants (living pictures), a look at the 2019 Pageant is helpful.

Titled "The Time Machine". it amazed audiences with the magic of "living pictures". Real people stepped into famous works of art by artists like Vermeer, Dali, Rockwell and Da Vinci for a one-of-a-kind theatrical experience, "The Time Machine" took audiences around the globe and into the past, present and future in search of great art and amazing stories. In a show that journeyed through time and space, audiences were presented with tributes to breakthroughs in both art and science. Highlights included homage to American sculptor Malvina Hoffman and her groundbreaking anthropological exhibit at Chicago's Field Museum of Natural History in 1933, and the 1913 Armory Show in New York which marked the dawn of Modernism in America. Innovations included laser lights, an authentic 1959 Juke box, and a UFO,"

Beginning in the early 1930's, Pageant of the Masters is a Laguna Beach tradition with attendance today approaching 150,000. The show is accompanied by original, live

music by the Pageant orchestra, with informative and engaging live narration. Year 2019 marked the 500th anniversary of the death of Renaissance master Leonardo da Vinci. His "Last Supper" continued to be the Pageant's traditional closing tableau for 2019, as it has been since 1936."
